

**Town of St. Albans  
Volunteer Opportunities**

Are you a Town resident who would like to get more involved with your local community? Would you like to learn more about the Town from the inside? If so, the Town of St. Albans has various exciting volunteer positions available. Appointments are made by the Selectboard.

**Development Review Board**

Staffed by our Zoning Administrator, the DRB is charged with conducting formal hearings on developments in a fair and unbiased manner. At their hearings, the Board takes testimony, reviews evidence, and renders decisions in accord with our regulations. In general, the DRB meets twice a month. There are two vacancies for 3 year terms and 2 alternate seats for a 1 year term available.

**Town Planning Commission**

If you have an interest in policy and directing the future of St. Albans Town then serving as a Planning Commissioner may be just for you. The Commission is a dynamic group whose work is instrumental in defining who we are as a community as they are responsible for drafting the Town Plan and Town regulations. Meetings are twice a month. There is one vacancy for a 3 year term.

**Regional Planning Commission**

This Commission consists of 2 members from each town in the Franklin/Grand Isle region. It is commissioned to plan for regional projects, bylaws, town plans etc. This commission meets monthly at Northwest Regional Planning Commission. There are 2 positions for 1 year terms available.

**Transportation Advisory Council**

Franklin/Grand Isle County TAC discusses repair issues to State and local bridges and roads as well as makes recommendations to the legislature. This council also discusses air, trail, and other transportation issues. Meetings are once a month. There are two positions available; a regular seat and an alternative.

**Northwest Vermont Rail Trail Council**

This council consists of 1 representative from each town in the Franklin County. It is a volunteer group looking out for the interests of the Missisquoi Valley Rail Trail, a 26 mile multi-season, multi-use recreation path between St. Albans and Richford in Franklin County.

**Northwest Vermont Solid Waste Management District**

NWSWD is governed by a Board of Supervisors comprised of one representative from each member town. The Board meets the first Wednesday of the month at the District office in Georgia. All meetings are open to the public.
